


Block Schedule

The high school has implemented block scheduling. There are two semesters, and students take four classes each semester. Each class period is eighty-eight (88) minutes long. The longer class periods allow the students to study topics in depth, to work together on projects, to develop critical thinking talents, and to receive individual attention from the teacher.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

COLLEGE COURSE @ QCC

Juniors and Seniors may elect to take a college course at Quinsigamond Community College (a placement exam in Math and English is required prior to registration). An Application is part of this process. A course approval must be granted by administration prior to registration at Q.C.C. (Application and 3.0 GPA required.) Students must pay tuition fees. Students receive high school and college credit.

TWELFTH YEAR PROGRAM @ QUINSIGAMOND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This is an application program open to seniors who wish to complete their senior year graduation requirements @ Q.C.C. Acceptance into the program must be granted by Q.C.C. and approval to attend granted by Administration as well.

MASSACHUSETTS ACADEMY OF MATH AND SCIENCE @ WPI

Mass Academy of Math and Science at WPI is a public, co-educational school of excellence program, which enrolls about 100 academically accelerated 11th and 12th graders each year. The school emphasizes math and science within a comprehensive, interactive academic program. The rigor of the junior year classes exceeds high school honors and AP, emphasizing depth over breadth, engaging students in project-based learning and more than 1200 hours of instruction. Seniors complete a full year of college, enrolling in classes at Worcester Polytechnic Institute, a nationally ranked engineering school, thus making the Academy the only public school in Massachusetts whose students attend a private university full-time as seniors in high school.

Students apply in January of their sophomore year. Minimum requirements are success in honors level math (minimum of Algebra II required) and science classes (Chemistry recommended), strong teacher recommendations, standardized test scores (PSAT preferred), participation in science related activities, extracurricular activities and community service considered.
